As many of you know, Mistress Joanne has been a proud and active member of the Leather/SM/ Fetish Community for about 25 years. The leather community is truly a family and, as families do, we take care of each other. That's why the Chicago Hellfire Club (CHC) created the McAdory Fund: to provide financial assistance to

Leatherfolk worldwide—not just to its own members.

Mistress Joanne writes "I am still in awe as I remember the sense of family I felt when CHC's McAdory Fund first gave me money to pay for medications while I was fighting my health insurer about coverage. I'm a strong believer in the circle of life and, when I needed help, the communities to which I'd given time, energy, laughter, tears, and love stood by me and helped me. One phone call from a friend, a member of CHC, and I received a check from The McAdory Fund. When I said I would pay the money back, I was told I could not since the Fund does not lend money; I was, however, welcome-but cer-

tainly not required—to make a donation any time. I tearfully (me?!) said that when I got it together I'd have one hell of a birthday party and would ask my friends to make donations to The McAdory Fund in lieu of giving me presents. That hell of a birthday party was my 45<sup>th</sup>, and I repeated the effort on my 50<sup>th</sup>. For my 55<sup>th</sup>, I added another leather community fund that has helped me: the Sorel Fund of The 15 Association (of San Francisco). Along the tumultuous path that has now led me to Florida, numerous friends assisted me and have my eternal gratitude. It was a hell of a time, and I only survived it thanks to you, my friends. You make my life worth living. I've almost made it to 60, in reasonably good condition (all things considered!), and thanks in no small part to your love and support. I truly believe some debts cannot be paid back but must instead be paid forward, and I would welcome your help in paying forward to The McAdory Fund or The Sorel Fund."



## FROM THE MEMBERSHIP CHAIR

As this hot summer winds down, I am looking forward to the cool air and hot play on the eastern shores of Lake Michigan at what is Inferno XLI.

If you're a first time guest to Inferno: Welcome! You have been invited to attend what some call the best allmale SM event in the world. You have been vouched for by a Club brother who has stated that you are ready to meet, play with, and be challenged by some of the best Leathermen around.

Guests often have questions about how to become a member of CHC. As a guest, your first resource for any question is always your sponsor. He should be able to explain the benefits and obligations of membership, what to expect and how to get the process started.

The application process starts with 3 current CHC members vouching for you, in writing, to the Club. These men will tell us about: your play experience; your contributions to your local Leather community; what they believe you can contribute to the Club; how you will wear our colors and represent CHC across the country and the world; and why they think you are worthy to be considered a Brother of the Chicago Hellfire Club. You should be prepared to tell your sponsors and other members who may ask, the same types of information from your perspective. Inferno is an excellent time to get to know the men of CHC and allow the men of CHC to get to know you; take advantage of the opportunity.

Attendance at Inferno is another requirement of membership. If you're not ready to attend Inferno, you can still be a guest of the Club. We have in-town events throughout the year where you can meet members for socializing and play. Come and get to know us better.

If you have any questions on the membership process, there will be a Membership Committee information Q&A session during each session. These will take place on the second full day of each session (Saturday and Tuesday) at 10 am. All interested guests and members are welcome to attend.

At the Q&A you will meet the men of the Membership Committee who will review, process and present your application.

Most of the men of the Membership Committee and of the full board will be in attendance at one, if not both sessions of Inferno. I balked at first, but soon found myself being walked over to Jon, my sponsor, because that's what sponsors are for.

Around 2 am on Sunday morning, we found Jon. Before I spoke a word, Jon took the cigarette out of his mouth and said, "You want to stay. Let's go find Mel."

We hunted around for Mel, that year's Inferno Coordinator, for a few minutes and found him near the stockade. Before Jon could open his mouth to tell Mel what we wanted, Mel inserted, "Yes, he can stay. I'll find him a spot, talk to me in the morning." By brunch, I had called my boss to extend my vacation, changed flights, and had been moved to another room


# NEERNO XLI CHARITY

### **CHC-Fireside Archives Preservation Fund**

In 2010, CHC entered into an agreement with the Leather Archives and Museum (LA&M) to establish a restricted fund for the purpose of maintaining, preserving, and developing CHC's archived materials; this fund is called the CHC-Fireside Archives Preservation Fund. The fund is under the maintenance and control of LA&M, and as such, donations to this fund would benefit from the LA&M's 501(c)(3) charitable, non-profit tax status. Fund use is restricted to activities with CHC archive materials.

During this year's Inferno XLI, contributions through various activities, such as the silent auction, boot blacking, and others, will benefit this fund. If you have items to donate, please contact Roger S.
