

There are so many things that I thought IML was about that I found out didn't matter or weren't correct. First off, believe it or not, it isn't competing against 58 other men to show you're better than they are. It is 58 brothers that are there to support you and each other as you go on the journey to show everyone, including yourself, the best of yourself and who you really are.

You all know what Inferno brotherhood feels like, the closeness and bonds that are created during intense scenes. Well I am here to say IML was that without the play (and yes I will make up for that soon). It was raw emotions and learning about my classmates, crying, laughing and a whole roller-coaster of emotions. It is amazing how close you can bond with 58 other men that you don't know in that short period of time, but it happens. The times that I shared with them will be with me for life. There were moments when brothers were shamed and everyone's temper flared up, family was taken into hospice and we cried and hugged together, people were cheering us and we all celebrated. It will be something that will take a while to fully appreciate. It was deep and it was spiritual.

The other thing that I didn't realize and I don't think others do either is the work that goes into this. Some days started at 8am and lasted until 11pm. It was crazy busy with rehearsals, interviews, poster signing, meetings and more. There isn't a lot of time for yourself or your loved ones. But you find a new family in your classmates, handlers, staff and officials of IML. I wish I could find the words to describe the feelings, but the closest I can say is this – it was love, brotherhood and devotion. I never dreamed that a man like me could be walking across that stage, but I did. It wasn't easy, being a big guy, wearing little to nothing in front of that many people is terrifying on many levels, but when it came time to do it, I felt no awkwardness, self shame or embarrassment. My brothers and handlers, held me up and said you are worthy of yourself and be proud.

IML may be different things to different people, but I have to agree in the end, yes it was life changing for me. It showed me what the power of brotherhood and love can do to a person. And for that I am grateful, honored and humbled to be a part of it.

If you or someone you know in the leather community has fallen on hard times, you should know about the McAdory Fund. Created by the Chicago Hellfire Club in the memory of Michael McAdory, the purpose of the fund is to provide financial support to members of the leather community who find themselves unable to pay rent, medical bills, food, or other necessities due to poor health, prolonged unemployment, or another serious life event. The McAdory Fund provides assistance to anyone in the leather community with urgent financial needs.

In 2015, the McAdory Committee made 33 grants totaling \$12,294.56. Grants were made for medical, utilities, housing, and transportation bills for members of the leather community who had fallen on hard times. That brings the total grants made since the founding of the McAdory Fund – nearly thirty years ago – to more than \$190,000. The funds for these grants come from a variety of fundraising events and individual donations.


As part of the McAdory committee, I have been able to see with my own eyes leathermen and women who were able to use their grants as a springboard to get past a major hurdle in their lives. I have seen this fund make a real difference.

House Rules

In order for the Chicago Hellfire Club to continue to be successful and full of hot sex and play during all of our events, it's important to remember some items so that problems won't interrupt our fun.

- To help maintain a good relationship with our neighbors, dress appropriately when you and your guests arrive and depart. This means:
- 1. No extreme leather, fetish wear or toys are to be worn or displayed outside the Club. No bare asses or chests, hoods, masks, leashes, or boys on their knees. Keep your toys and tools out of sight until you are inside the Clubhouse.
- 2. Arrive and depart quietly.
- All attendees are required to show their valid, government-issued ID. When you arrive, we like to get everyone inside as quickly as possible so we don't have a line on the street. Having your ID out when you get to the check-in window just inside the door will keep the line moving quickly.
- Photography is strictly prohibited in the Clubhouse except by Club designated photographers – don't risk getting caught!
 Just don't take pictures of that hot scene you were watching or involved in. Keep everyone safe.
- Drug use will not be tolerated.
- We take our members' and guests' safety seriously. DMs are on duty to ensure someone is watching, but it is the responsibility of all members to enforce the Club's safer sex policies, listed in our Standing Legislation, Attachment 19. Prohibitions include, but are not limited to: unprotected anal intercourse; fisting without rubber gloves; needles, pins, catheters, sounds, or other devices intended to break the skin or invade a body orifice used on more than one individual without sterilization between uses; sharing of sex toys which come in contact with any bodily secretions.
