A New Charity for Inferno

Greetings

For many years, the CHC maintained a cycle of three standard Inferno charities: the Leather Archives & Museum, the McAdory fund, and the CHC Preservation Fund. We always had an option to work in a fourth recipient. This year, the Inferno Committee has selected a new designated charity for Inferno 47: the Broadway Youth Center (BYC).

The BYC is a safe haven for LGBTQ youth that aims to provide at-risk young people with culturally competent options for

healthcare. It caters to young people who often have experienced challenging life circumstances.

The services provided by the BYC are essential for supporting positive growth in youth who have experienced trauma. As they grow into young adults, the BYC helps them learn ways to engage in positive social and working relationships, and to develop their values and identity. Through their services and a harm-reduction framework, the BYC supports young people in self-determining their needs for growth and personal success.

These services include:

- Medical care
- · Crisis intervention counseling
- Behavioral health services
- Basic needs drop-in services
- Youth leadership opportunities
- HIV/STI testing and prevention programs
- Educational and Vocational services

AUGUST Friday Bar Night and Saturday Demo and Play Party

Friday, Aug. 10 – SoFo Tap, 10pm to 1am

Come join your kinky brothers at one of the friendliest bars in Chicago! Wear your colors, introduce yourself, and get the conversation going!

Saturday Aug. 11, Demo and Play Party

The demo presenter will be our Membership Chair, Rob D, and the topic is "Impact Play."

Rob writes, "Toys are lots of fun, but play opportunities sometimes happen when we aren't expecting them or when we can't readily get to our toys. What to do? How can we make that play opportunity happen? I often say that the two most important toys are the ones you bring with you everywhere – your hands.

"In this session, you'll learn to be creative with your hands. There are many different ways the hands can be used to hit the body and its various parts. We'll also explore the use of arms and other body parts in impact play. I'll show you how to use your hands to inflict gentle sensations all the way to the most intense pain.

"This is a "hands-on" workshop in which participants will experience impact from both sides. Bring a partner or find one there."

Saturday August 18, 10am to 3pm CHC SMU Presents "Sounds like Fun!" with Tony W and Steve D.

Curious about sounding scenes? Been afraid of sounds? Have you've seen sounding in movies and wondered what it feels like inside your cock? In this class we will explore the basics of sounding.

We'll introduce you to male anatomy, specifically the urethra, and review the different types of sounds, how to use them and how to sound safely.

And once that silver rod hits your prostate, you'll see stars (good, happy stars). We'll follow up with a live demo which will also cover combining e-stim with sounding.

FROM THE PRESIDENT

A Feeling of Inclusion

Greetings, Members and Guests.

As Inferno draws near, I wanted to send out a little reminder to one and to all about inclusion and unity.

Attending Inferno as a first-time guest, or even as a returning guest, can be an intimidating and overwhelming experience. We as members need to make sure that our guests feel wanted and included. That means when you see someone by themselves, please approach them and talk to them.

If you see someone in the stockade looking lost as to where to sit, or whom to sit with, help them out. Offer them a seat across from you or near you. Introduce them to the group of guys you sit with, so they meet more people.

Let's remember that flipping chairs over to save seats can send a negative message to newcomers — it says, "you're not welcome to sit here," "you're not wanted here", or "you don't belong with us."

Break Bread with the New Guys

I do understand that for many of us, the chance to break bread with brothers that we only see once a year is important and meaningful, and I would not want to take that reunion away from any one.

That said, I do want each and every one of us to be aware that by always sitting at the exact same table with the exact same guys, makes guests and "newbies" feel left out. I want us to take steps toward inclusiveness, while at the same time, eliminate this perception that there is a certain elitism based on being a long-time member or a long-time Inferno attendee.

Guests and first-timers, put yourself out there. Don't be afraid to introduce yourself

to people. Don't be afraid to socialize with folks you don't know. Don't be afraid to sit next to, or across from, a group of people in the stockade. Mix, mingle, and insert yourself with others.

If you do see chairs saved, don't take it as "you're not wanted." Look at it as an opportunity to sit at the very next seat so you can meet a whole group of guys at once. Turn it into a positive. Members, please be aware of our new guests. Please notice and then do something if you see someone looking lost or alone. These are our guests. Collectively, we all have the responsibility to look out for them. Invite them to sit with you and your established friends. Introduce them to people.

Look After Your Guests

If you are a member who has sponsored a guest at Inferno, your role as his sponsor does not end after first-timers orientation. You should be looking out for him the whole time, especially in the stockade. Don't let one of your sponsored guests flounder in that sea of established cliques. It is inconsiderate, and it is disappointing. You invited him, you look after him, you introduce him to folks. It really is that simple.

Board members and Inferno Committee members, I ask you to go the extra mile – please make an effort to reach out to newbies. If you see them floundering in the stockade, approach them. Maybe sit down and have a meal with men you have never met before. They could learn stuff about Inferno and the club, just by having a meal and some conversation with you. The BoD and the Inferno Committee need to be ambassadors of this event.

We always talk about the closing ceremony and how powerful that can be. I think we need to lay the seeds for that well before that last brunch. Let's include everyone

House Rules

In order for the Chicago Hellfire Club to continue to be successful and full of hot sex and play during all of our events, it's important to remember some items so that problems won't interrupt our fun.

- To help maintain a good relationship with our neighbors, dress appropriately when you and your guests arrive and depart. This means:
- 1. No extreme leather, fetish wear or toys are to be worn or displayed outside the club. No bare asses or chests, hoods, masks, leashes, or boys on their knees. Keep your toys and tools out of sight until you are inside the clubhouse.
 - 2. Arrive and depart quietly.
- All attendees are required to show their valid, government-issued ID. When you arrive, we like to get everyone inside as quickly as possible so we don't have a line on the street. Having your ID out when you get to the check-in window just inside the door will keep the line moving quickly.
- PHOTOGRAPHY IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED IN THE
 CLUBHOUSE except by club designated photographers –
 Don't risk getting caught! Just don't take pictures of that hot
 scene you were watching or involved in. Keep everyone safe.
 - Drug use will not be tolerated.

Clean Up

Clean up after yourself. Think G.E.T. L.A.I.D.

Before leaving the clubhouse, keep these things in mind:

GARBAGE

Have you picked up trash, emptied all the garbage cans, relined them and taken the trash to the alley?

ELECTRIC

Have you turned off all electric appliances—coffee pot, fans, smoke eater, etc.?

THERMOSTAT

Have you turned off all air conditioners?

LIGHTS

Have you turned off all the lights, including the bathrooms and back halls?

AMPLIFIERS

Are you sure you've turned off all amplifiers (CD player, radios, tape players, TV, etc.)?

INSIDE DOORS

Have you locked the office door and checked all back doors?

DOOR

Will you be sure to check the front door and make sure it is locked securely after you have gone out?
