Brotherhood From the Inferno Coordinator

From Opening Ceremonies during Inferno 50. This was what stood out for most people attending:

I couldn't come up with an answer to this one because it didn't have any problems. The person in this picture was doing what he loves to do, and the person or people who did it were doing what they love to do. That's the essence of what we do here, more than any design, it's the space to be a truer version of ourselves than we can allow anywhere else in our lives. "Brotherhood" may be an overused term but there is no other term that suits the collection of men I look forward to seeing each September. Because here, more than anywhere else, we can bare our rawest selves.

Even if the men in the pictures aren't any of you per se, in a way, they still are you. You have the same desires, the same drives, the same skills and instincts that brings us all here year after year. Each of you feels the same thing that men at this event have felt for fifty years. Last year may have been peculiar, and let us hope it is unique, but we have gathered through a plague, through the scorn of the community, through economic collapse, even through a terrorist attack against our nation. Because how we feel, and who we know we are, cannot be quieted.

Look at the man on your left. Now look at the man on your right. Look well, because you ARE Inferno. Without the extraordinary group of men gathered here, Inferno is just a bunch of wood and metal strewn around a plot of land. It is us who are Inferno. An unbroken chain of us from the early 1970s. Of cries and moans and bruises and blood, that make all of us better versions of ourselves. We are men who come from all kinds of backgrounds, who come here and find kindred spirits of a type that cannot be found anywhere else on our globe.

That is what I see in this picture. I see a man who cannot be identified by face or voice, but can be identified by spirit. He belongs here, as does each of you. You build this sacred ground simply with your presence. You are why we have a half century of brotherhood.







J. Paul Eaton Award By Mike M

The J. Paul Eaton Award is given to that man (or men) who have made outstanding contributions to Inferno over the years, generally behind the scenes. At Inferno 50, **Mike B** was awarded the J. Paul Eaton Award. Comments below were delivered by the Inferno 48 winner, **Mike M**, September 2021.

SPOKEN BY MIKE M

I have to admit, winning the J. Paul Eaton award at Inferno 48 gave me a slight relief, knowing I would not have to speak at Inferno 50, but here we are.

Before I get to this year's winner, I want to take a moment to tell you why being recognized with this award is such an honor to me.

For my brothers who know me well, neither of the next two statements of fact are going to be a surprise, but these are not necessarily things I advertise. In the interest of destigmatizing mental illness, you should all know that I suffer from major depressive disorder. One in five westerners suffer a major depressive event in their lifetime. I work terribly hard to limit an episode to once a year. I fight the dark clouds every day, and I win some, and I lose some; and I am eternally grateful to my brothers who both recognize this and who hold me accountable for my own happiness.

The second thing I want to share is that I am a survivor of sexual assault. When I was 19, my "Sir" sent me to a man with whom he was friendly. In my naiveté in the days of IRC and AOL, I trusted my Sir, not knowing that the two men had never met in person. Despite this being more than 25 years ago, the experience still colors my engagement with the leather community. It is you, the men in this room, and those who have gone before us, who have stood by me

through thick-and thin. You have led and I have followed, you have pushed me ahead and walked behind me to support me, and you have walked alongside when I needed it, boot prints mysteriously appearing in step with mine along the journey which we have walked together. I am so honored by being awarded the J. Paul Eaton award, and why I could not stand here today without these gentlemen standing behind me, supporting me as I share with you this experience. As our brother Daniel N said 3 years ago, you are my heroes. This event is an opportunity to play with my heroes every year.

When I first came to Inferno as a 26 year old boy, I was naïve, rambunctious, and awestruck. I knew I was somewhere special, despite being a 140 pound bundle of nerves who got just lucky enough to miss the infamous "van to Ohio." But I knew something that is still true today. What gave me the greatest fullfilment was to make problems go away for the Men who led me. I was joking with my brother Adam Schwenk even today that I was never the "let me clean your kitchen, Sir," kind of boy. Instead, I was more of a "let me go make enough money so you can hire a maid, Sir," one. Almost 20 years has mellowed and matured me, taught me how to be that rock for the boys who follow, and given me the opportunity to be a servant leader, like so many of you were for me.

My job every year is to make sure each and every one of you is successful. Satan's Station exists to ensure, 24 hours a day, that we all can play safely, have clean towels, and can solve the unique problems that come from being locked in the run site for 3 days at a time. The spirit of our brother Paul is making problems disappear. It is not about being recognized for what is done but being recognized for what doesn't need to be done.

The point of why we award the J. Paul Eaton award is that there are many of us who choose to serve this club without seeking recognition for ourselves. No one standing here behind me sought out recognition, we each sought out ways we could demonstrate our commitment to this community. Our job is service. Making the lives easier of those who seek out public roles. Ensuring that this event we all value is successful. The best celebration of each of us standing here is that we return each year, pandemic or no, and give this gift to those who

join us each year. To pay it forward.

In that spirit, this year's J. Paul Eaton award winner is deserving of our honor for his service to the club. He is someone who never says no. He is never not working when there is work to be done. He identifies and performs tasks before anyone else knows it needs to be done.

It is my privilege to recognize Mike B as the 2021 winner of the J. Paul Eaton award.

Mike has done setup 6 of the 7 years which he has attended, only missing the first year. He owns both the setup and teardown of the Sleaze Tent. His crew members know he is the first to start and the last to leave each day in setup. He does this because it means so much to him for all of us here at the event to come in and play. He exemplifies service.

Mike also likes to play, his favorite piece of equipment is the spanking bench. He designs and makes his own toys, and is truly a masochist for coming up with more evil ways his tops can hurt him. You might remember that a couple years ago, he raised money walking through camp with a bucket of beers attached to his balls.

He also knows how to make a presidential strength drink, which is probably a service to all of us here, not just to Mr. Rosen.

AWARD PRESENTATION

This year's winner has a truly magic power. Somehow, almost any tent or part of the compound he plays in can become the Noisy Dungeon. Here, allow me to demonstrate: [BRIAN B. BITES ANDREW IN AUDIENCE.]

Andrew has been coming here since Inferno 32. It's hard for me to believe something I heard him say this afternoon, that he almost left during his first Inferno, because in the years since then he has become such a presence at this event that it would feel like something is missing without him. He has worked setup for years, appeared in several opening ceremonies, given demos, and been a regular on the DM staff.

But I think for me it's his commitment to others having a good experience that sticks out. I heard him tell someone this afternoon "what are you looking for, if I'm not into it, I can probably find someone who is." He has a way of setting up scenes and pulling in passers by, inviting the curious to try things they maybe hadn't even seen before.

Afternoons painting boys and slaves in liquid latex. His "whack and wax" tables. Getting chased for hours by puppies on Dish Hill. Explaining how electrical toys work and inviting others to try them out on caged subs. He is extremely giving of his time and his knowledge, in ways that make others feel welcome and open to new experiences.

He plays for himself, sure, as we all do, but he also plays in ways that create opportunities for others to play even more.

And not just here - he regularly runs large scene demos at Mr. International Rubber, and even just wandering the halls of the hotel at International Mr. Leather and other events

you're likely to find him out and about with his car polish buffer.

And then there's that - is it a laugh? A cackle? What word are we going with here.

I've heard several men here this week, in musing over the year we had to miss, talk about what Inferno sounds like. Andrew's laugh has become one of those sounds of Inferno that let you know you're home.
